PRESENTATIONS

1. 2016 – 2017 New High School Courses – Mr. McFarland, High School Principal, presented proposal for 2016 – 2017 new High School courses to be offered: CCP Psychology, CCP Sociology and Civil Engineering & Architecture. The courses were presented for discussion, as a first read, with consideration for approval at future meeting.

CCP Psychology

Grade 9, 10, 11, 12

1 Credit

University-parallel course covering history and systems of psychology, behavioral research methods, physiology of behavior, sensation, perception, learning, memory, consciousness, cognition, personality, lifespan development, gender, social psychology, motivation, emotion, stress, mental disorders and therapies. Semester course = 3 credit hours through Sinclair taught at FHS. Must apply and be accepted by Sinclair as a CCP student.

CCP Sociology

Grade 9, 10, 11, 12

1 Credit

A critical analysis of contemporary American society with review of major sociological theories, research methods, culture, socialization, groups, social structure, social institutions, deviance, social qualities, social processes and social change. Semester course = 3 credit hours through Sinclair taught at FHS. Must apply and be accepted by Sinclair as a CCP student.

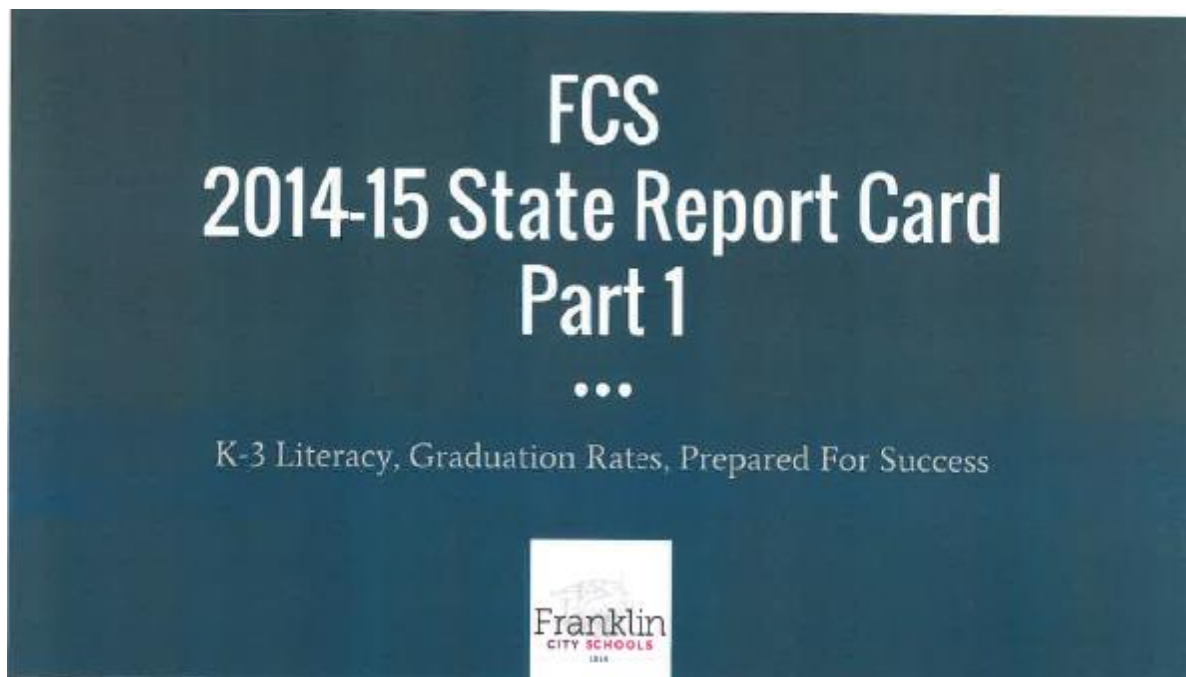
Civil Engineering & Architecture (CEA)

Grade 11, 12

1 Credit

Students learn important aspects of building and site design and development. They apply math, science, and standard engineering practices to design both residential and commercial projects and document their work using 3D architecture design software. Prerequisites 2 or more previous PLTW classes, open to juniors and seniors.

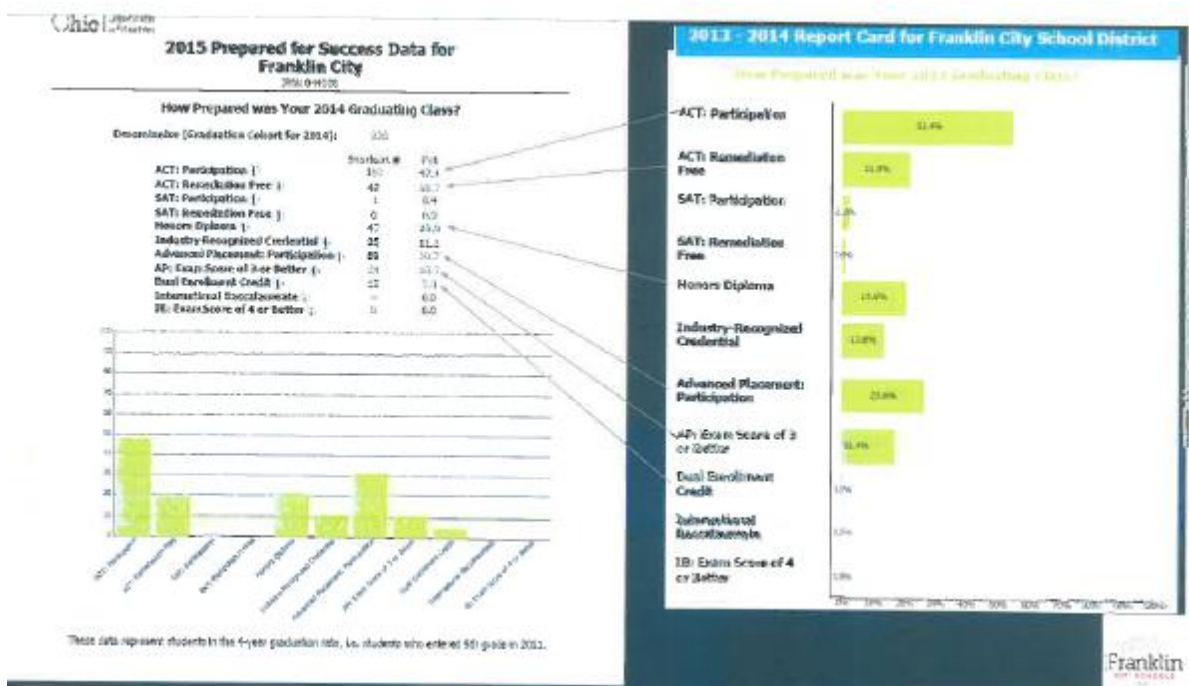
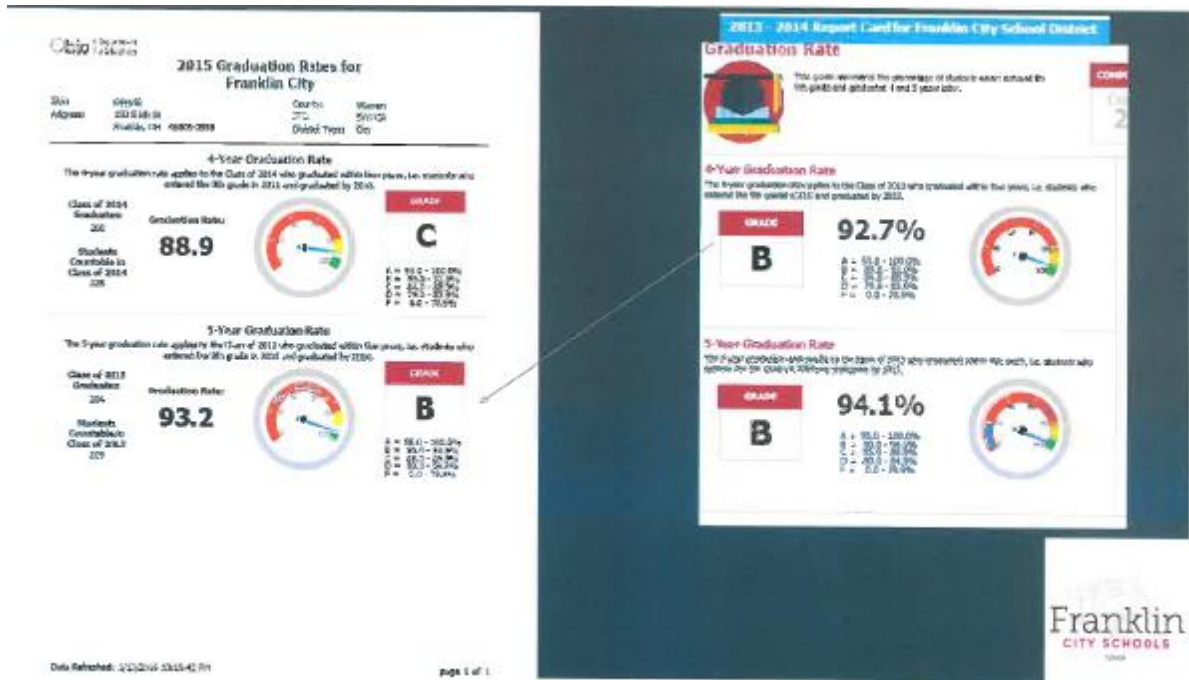
